WCCC 2024 Jūrmala, Quick Composing Tourney, Group A: Helpmates

Theme: Helpmates in 2,5 to 3 moves are required. In each line of play, a white piece moves and pins (directly) a black unit. There is a thematic constraint: The black unit that is pinned must make at least one move before or after the pin occurs and/or the black king must move to the pin-line.


Fairy pieces are allowed, but no conditions.

Deadline: Sunday 28 July, 18:00 hrs. Judge: Harry Fougiaxis Director: Mihail Croitor

I received from the director 11 helpmates (six in 3 moves and five in 2,5 moves) without authors' names. It is a great pity that the most ambitious composition (and the single one featuring fairy pieces) is unthematic, as the white pinning piece does not move in the solutions.

I propose the following ranking:

No. 3 - Menachem Witztum & Ricardo de Mattos Vieira Quick Composing Tourney, J**ū**rmala 2024 1st Place



Well-crafted diagonal-orthogonal echo play with Kniest captures to let the bK get trapped into the mating net, pins of the black units initially standing on the mating lines and exchange of black roles (Rd4 and Bc4 are alternately captured and block the king's departure square). There is a slight imbalance in that whereas 1.Re×d5 in (a) is a pure (self-pin) hideaway move, 1.Qb5 in (b) is actually an anticipatory block & check-avoidance, as White has no other way to guard effectively the b5 square [1.Q~ off the board (Qc7) b×c4 2.K×c4 Bd7? / B×a6+? cannot work anyway.] A clear winner.



Smart and original rendering of the theme with virtual pins (no pin-mates!), as the white pinning moves are actually sacrifices to enable the black pieces block a flight. Zilahi comes as a straightforward bonus.



Nice diagonal-orthogonal play: the promoted black pieces that block the flights must be pinned as they would otherwise interfere with the mates, black-white FML, blocks of the "rear" flights and models. Sadly, not so original (compare to Gennady Chumakov & Fadil Abdurahmanović, Prize Shakhmatnaya Kompozitsiya 2010, https://yacpdb.org/#321228)


No. 5 - Abdelaziz Onkoud Quick Composing Tourney, J**ū**rmala 2024 4th Place

The openings of the bQ lines dictate the move order. Cute and economic, but twinning slightly detracts.

Clear presentation, but the move  $1...R \times h3$  is rather weak and the cook-stopping bQ somewhat expensive.
